Dilico has two feast times each year, in the spring and fall where all site bundles and sacred items are brought together to be blessed. Traditional foods were offered and shared to say chi-miigwetch to the ancestors. The ceremonies were finished with giveaways and a shared meal.

Post Majority Support Funding

FOR YOUTH AGING OUT OF CARE OR YOUNG PERSONS
FORMERLY IN CARE- AGES 18-25



SAFE & SECURE HOUSING

Potential funding available to assist with rent, rent subsidies, interim housing options, housing stability, housing-related skills training, household necessities, household utilities and home repairs.

EMPLOYMENT



Funding applications can be completed for professional development and skills training, career path planning, financial support for required training and certifications (ex. First Aid, Safe Food Handling), childcare, cultural considerations and resources for support.

EDUCATION



Assistance to navigate education systems and options, access to resources related to education and rights, specialized supports such as tutoring, technology required for educational purposes and education-related costs could potentially be reimbursed.

PHYSICAL, MENTAL HEALTH & WELL-BEING



Funding could be available for sexual and gender identity health supports, access to recreation and sports, counselling, healthy relationships, parenting services, nutrition training, self-care and access to holistic health services and treatment of choice.

FINANCIAL SECURITY



Needs-based financial support such as budgeting, credit, money management, equitable funding for basic needs, clothing, hygiene items, financial literacy programs, financial advisors, costs for acquiring ID, livable basic income options and support with associated living costs for stability.

RECONNECTION TO CULTURE & LANGUAGE



Building lifelong connection to community, developing support networks, reconnection to family, community and culture, land-based wellness, cultural programs, ceremonies, exploring funding for language and identity courses, workshops and resources.

Do you know a youth who has aged out of care between the ages of 18-25? Have you heard of Post Majority Support Services? Funds are available to help them achieve their goals today! Supports could include assistance with housing, food, employment and financial security, mental health, wellness, addiction supports, cultural supports and healthy relationships.

Direct Service costs that can be funded are identified through 4 main areas:

- Financial Support & Safe, Stable,
 Comfortable Housing
- Learning, Educational & Professional Development Opportunities
- Physical, Mental, & Social Wellbeing
- (Re)Connection with Land, Culture, Language & Community

PMSS provides wrap-around support that meets the distinct needs of First Nations youth and young adults by promoting and supporting holistic positive outcomes for them to thrive as they transition to adulthood.

Eligible youth are those who exercised a voluntary care provision to leave care prior to the age of majority, AND young adults who were in care on the day they reached age of majority, from age 18- up until their 26th Birthday. Eligibility is confirmed by the First Nation or service provider requesting PMSS funding.




Children's Mental Health Week a Huge Success!


